



Each of the Detection clinics examines thirty to forty applicants in a two-hour period, one day each week. Any person who is found to have a suspicious lesion is re-Ment clinic where his case is thoroughly studied by a staff of specialists. These specialists make a complete diagnosis and recommend modern and adequate treatment and management for the patient. The final diagnosis and recommendations are sent by letter to the patient's personal physician. Approximately 25 per cent of those examined in the Detection clinic are referred to the Diagnostic cli-

Disposition of Patients No treatment is carried out in

the clinic. All those who are found in need of treatment, whether for cancer or another ailment, are referred back to their family or personal physicians for treatment.

Who is admitted to the clinics

for examination? This is a pertinent question. The answer is: Any citizen of North Carolina, without regard to race, color, creed or economic circumstances. For the sake of a speedy survey of a relatively large number of citizens most liable to have cancer, only men and women 40 years of age or older are admitted to the Detection clinics. There are some other 800,000 citizens in the State 40 years of age or older. One hundred thousand of these men and women are now doomed to die with cancer.
