Mrs. Frank Swindell received a wall plate for high score and Mrs. Alphonzo James, a similar prize.

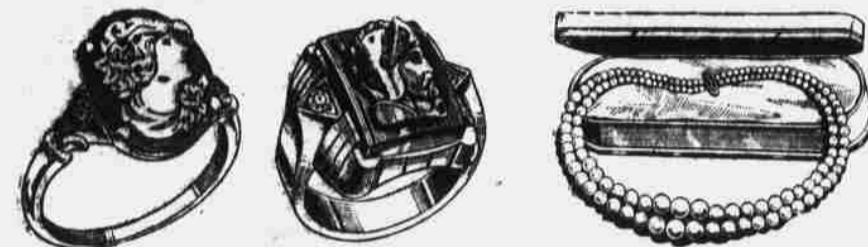
Cantata To Be Presented By Franklin Memorial
