Mrs. Eddie Jones Wins Woman's Club Prize

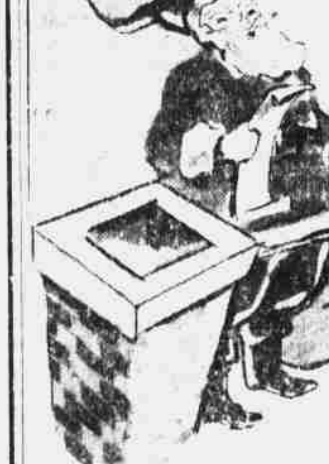
