COMMERICAL FISHERIES REGULATIONS
 The violation of which constitutes a misdemeanor. Published in compliance with Article 136 of Chapter 113 of the North Carolina General Statutes.
 The following regulations were adopted February 17, 1950, in accordance with authority given by the Board of the North Carolina Department of Conservation and Development, the said Board being vested with regulatory powers as provided for in Sections 135 and 136 of Chapter 113, General Statutes of North Carolina.
 I. Regulation adopting Rule 175. Shrimping be prohibited with trawlers in the inland waters of North Carolina under the jurisdiction of the Department of Conservation and Development from January 1 to July 1 of each year.
 2. Regulation adopting Rule 176. I. The Commercial Fisheries line be moved from its present point on the Neuse River near the bridge at Goldsboro to a point on the Neuse known as Pitch Kettle approximately 20 miles East of Kinston.
 II. The line between Wildlife Resources Commission and Commercial Fisheries on Slocum Creek be moved from its present point 3/4 mile of the mouth up the creek to the mouth of Tucker Creek.
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 V. The line between Wildlife Resources Commission and Commercial Fisheries on Mitchell and Gulden Creeks be established at the mouth of the creeks.
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 VII. The line between Wildlife Resources Commission and Commercial Fisheries on Beard's Creek be moved from its present point at the mouth 3/4 mile up stream.
 VIII. All other regulations in conflict with these regulations are hereby revoked.
