With only 17 counties participat ng, North Carolina has 30,560 crop naurance contracts in force. Of his number, 23,574 were signed in 1950, and the other 6,986 are carry from previous years. contracts are written on a continuing basis and remain in effect un-til cancelled.

In addition, Mann said, the Tar Heel State has the highest percentage of eligible farmers signed up cotton counties, and its record in premium collections last year second highest in the S and well above the national aver


