

APPLICATION CAN BE MADE TO COUNTY BOARD OF ELECTIONS BY THE VOTER, OR AN IMMEDIATE MEMBER OF HIS OR HER FAMILY.

APPLICATIONS MUST SHOW FULL ADDRESS OF VOTER SO THAT TICKET MAY BE SENT DIRECT BY COUNTY BOARD OF ELECTION. APPLICATION MUST SHOW THE PARTY VOTER BELONGS TO.
