R. L. Frost, meteorologist in charge of the Wilmington Weather Bureau, visited Morehead City and Beaufort Friday to complete plans for installing a surface wind ane-mometer at radio station WMBL.

Thirty-eight such instruments will measure wind velocity at vital points along the Gulf and Atlantic coasts from Texas to Maine. The one at Morehead City has a top priority rating and should be ready for use this season, Mr. Frost said


