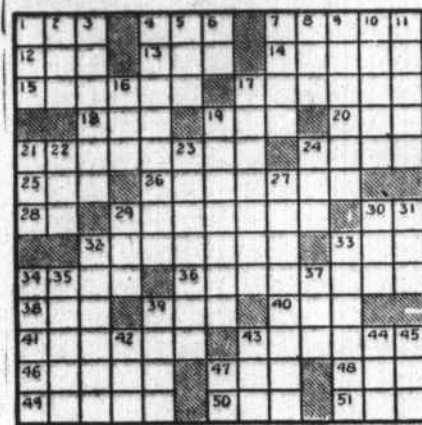

**Legend of the Lost Stars
John Wayne, Sophia Loren**

John Wayne and Sophia Loren share top billing in Legend of the Lost, scheduled to play all next week at the Morehead Theatre. Both stars come through with top performances that make for solid entertainment.

Heart-warming entertainment inspired by one of the most poignant true stories in American folklore abounds in All Mine to Give, which will play Sunday through Tuesday at the City Theatre.

Published twice in Cosmopolitan magazine under the title, The Day They Gave Babies Away, the story combines humor and pathos in giving a completely personal account of ancestral pioneering on the Wisconsin frontier way back in 1865.

A double feature, Carnival Rock and Teenage Thunder, will play Wednesday and Thursday at the City. On Friday and Saturday it will be The Hired Gun and The Unknown Terror.

The action in The Hired Gun begins when Rory Calhoun, portraying a gun-slinger of the 1870's, agrees at a price to bring back Anne Francis. Miss Francis has escaped to her father's New Mexico ranch from a jail in Texas, just before she was due to hang

for the supposed murder of her husband. A series of adventures of cumulative excitement follows when Calhoun forces the girl to return with him to Texas on horseback and in the course of subsequent events learns of her innocence and is instrumental in the capture of the real murderer.

John Howard, Mala Powers and Paul Richards are starred in The Unknown Terror. The movie is set in the mountains of Mexico, where a group of cave explorers expect to locate the Cave of Death.
