Sgt. Charles G. Pitts Now Serves at Norfolk

Norfolk, Va. — Marine M/Sgt. Charles G. Pitts, husband of the former Miss Edith S. Skarren of Beaufort, is serving with the Hobby Shop of Headquarters and Service Battalion, Fleet Marine Force, Atlantic, Norfolk, Va.

He reported to Norfolk Feb. 20 from the Marine Corps Schools, Quantico, Va.

Pitts entered the service in July 1920.

U. S. Sixth Fleet — James L. Following operations the crew is scheduled to visit Barcelona, Spain, during the latter part of March.

Shortly after joining the Sixth Fleet in February, the Saratoga hosted 40 NATO officers and wives from the Allied Forces, Southern Europe Headquarters in Naples.
