Time for April 4-H Club meetings has rolled around. This month we start with Camp Glenn and Morehead on Tuesday, April 8. Newport 4-H Clubs meet Wednesday, Atlantic 4-H on Thursday and Harkers Island 4-H on Friday.

The Smyrna 4-Hers meet Monday, April 14 and Beaufort 4-H on Wednesday. The Merrimon Community 4-H will meet Friday, April 18. Do you realize that this is our next to last meeting this school year?

We've had a time trying to hold our second 4-H Electric Workshop meeting. First there was a delay in getting materials that forced a postponement. This Friday night has met with opposition since it is Easter weekend, so the next workshop will be held April 11 and 12 at the same places, same times as the first workshops. The electric motors that each of you will build for yourself have arrived so everything will be ready.

The Third Annual Coastal Carolina Market Stock Show and Sale will be held in New Bern Tuesday. I would like for any of you interested in raising and showing hogs and beef cattle to attend if you possibly can. The judging of hogs begins at 8 a.m. and the judging of cattle at 9:30.

At 11 a.m. there will be a fitting and showmanship contest for junior exhibitors. I would like for you to see how these 4-Hers learn to handle, groom, and care for their steers. Last year's grand champion was shown by Elaine Parker, Jones County 4-H'er, and I understand she has another nice steer this year.

Spring clean-up is more important than just sprucing up for appearance's sake. We can reduce the loss of lives and property if we practice the clean-up habit on our farms and in our homes. Here are some pointers for eliminating fire hazards:

Get rid of stacks of old magazines and newspapers, discarded clothing, rags, mattresses, old furniture, and other junk—all the clutter that gathers in attics, basements and closets in homes. Check barns and out-buildings for similar trash, clean up winter rubbish in the farmyard, get rid of dead grass and brush around buildings, along fences, and in fields.

Clean up your machine shop—get rid of shavings, scraps, oily rags, old paints. Clean up, oil and repair all electrical equipment and power machinery—and home appliances, too. Inspect and clean furnace, chimney, stoves, brooders and heaters of all types.

If every farm will act on these pointers during Spring clean-up—and the rest of the year—our area can set an enviable record in fire safety.
