

Micky Porpoise Finds New Home at Oceanarium

Micky was wrapped in a heavy blanket with mattress padding around that and then put in a water-tight wooden box. His captors, Capt. and Mrs. Milton Santini, put salt water in the box, stuck it in the back of a station wagon and drove the 1,026 miles from Marathon, Fla., to Atlantic Beach in less than 26 hours.

Marine Biologist Speaks to Club

Dr. Harold Humm of Duke Marine Laboratory, Pivers Island, was guest speaker at the Beaufort Rotary Club meeting Tuesday night. The club met at the Scout building.

Dr. Humm spoke on food productivity of the sea. He pointed out that 99 per cent of man's food is grown on land, 29 per cent of the earth's surface. Only one per cent comes from the sea that covers the other 71 per cent of the surface of the earth.
