and Fort Macon Boulevard east and Beaufort Avenue.

Mr. Mendenhall, who operates a cafe and grill, was told that the closing hours of 1 a.m. would have to be maintained. Mr. Mendenhall wanted to keep his place open all night. The board said that if one place stayed open, all would have to be allowed to stay open, which would require hiring additional police officers. That is an expense the town board said could not be met at present.

The board said that opening at 4 a.m., as some restaurants do, is permissible.

Norwood Young, representing his mother, Mrs. C. R. Young, a cottage-owner, said that sand packing an alley to the cottage is a hazard. Archie F. Fleming, street commissioner, said that the sand would be moved and clay put on sand at the sides of the alley to prevent sand from drifting on the thoroughfare.

The street commissioner also said that a washout at Atlantic Boulevard and Raleigh Avenue would be fixed. It was announced that the first public hearing on zoning the beach would be at 2 p.m. Thursday, July 10.

The state did not prosecute Paul R. Johnson or Howard Rose Jr. due to lack of evidence. Each was charged with motor vehicle violations.

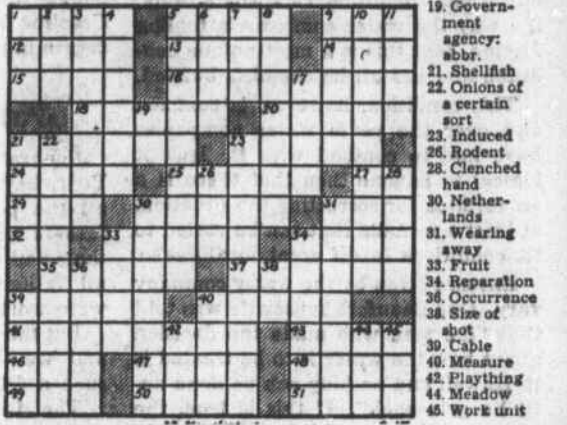
