Ponies will be penned on Cedar Island Friday, July 4. The penning will take place between 11 a.m. and 1 p.m.

Plans for the event were made at a recent meeting at Cedar Island when the Cedar Island Pony Association was organized.

Purpose of the organization is to improve the island grazing range and provide better facilities for viewing the penning.

A water tank is being built now and plans are under way to construct a larger corral before the Fourth.

It was agreed that there will be at least one general penning each

year and not more than three. The July Fourth penning will be an annual affair. If others are to be held, they will be scheduled by the association. The penning will be at Cedar Island beach at the end of Highway 74 east and will be free to the public.

Detour Set Up in Western Area

Raleigh—Motorists in the second and third highway divisions, traveling from Maysville to NC 24, 4.1 miles east of Swansboro, will encounter a detour.

While a county road is being graded, through traffic will be detoured from Maysville to Belgrade for one mile on US 17, a county road from Belgrade to NC 24, via Silverdale for 13 miles—7.1 miles east of the project via Swansboro. Local traffic will be maintained over the route. The detour will remain in effect until January of 1959.

Total length of the detour, according to R. A. Pollock, resident engineer on the project, is 19.1 miles, all of which are paved.
