night, boisterous and profane language, and said that nearly every payday (at Cherry Point) there were fights there.

Walter Whitley, who lives three-tenths of a mile east of Ann's on highway 70, testified that the place had a "bad reputation as to prostitution". On Feb. 1, he testified that he had awakened by men fighting in his front yard.

Men Fight

When he tried to break up the fight, one of them came after him and the fellow stopped only when Whitley threatened to kill him. The next morning, he said, the man came back and apologized, found his car keys in Whitley's front yard and went to Ann's place where he had left the car the night before and drove off in it.

In a pre-hearing statement, Mr.

Wheatly pointed out that the place has not been closed by the ABC board because no infraction of the beer laws has taken place there. He stated that the court non-suited a case against Sonny Sykes, Ann's husband, who shot and killed a Marine there March 12.

He claimed the shooting has no bearing on whether Ann's should be closed.

The state in its allegations has not charged that Ann's Drive-in is a place of prostitution. The state is alleging that it is a scene of disorder, fights, drunkenness, and a disturbing element in the neighborhood.
