Cook Patents Frying Device

Richmond, Va. (AP)—This business of frying an egg is a whole lot more than just keeping the breakfast staple from spreading all over the plate—take it from Edward E. Gangwer.

Gangwer, food service manager at the State Penitentiary, says frying an egg is an exact culinary science that deserves more attention than it has gotten from sleep-drugged bachelors and lazy housewives.

Gangwer's goal is master egg frying so he has patented a device to fry the numerous eggs at the penitentiary perfectly and all just alike. He got the idea while cooking for the Navy during the war.

The patent office describes it as "a device for frying a plurality of eggs simultaneously." Several dozen Grade A's get exactly the same treatment in steel cups which are handled in unison.
