Merchants Figure System to Catch Bad Check Artists

Champaign, Ill. (AP) — Several cities in this area, are co-ordinating their efforts in a "Check Alert System."

Fred W. Simmering, managing secretary of the local Association of Commerce, says under the system the merchant who is suspicious of a check notes down characteristics of the passer, including a physical description and, if possible, a license plate number.

Then the association staff calls from 5 to 10 local merchants. Each calls 5 or 10 others and, in a matter of minutes, merchants all over the community have been informed.
