Cat on a Hot Tin Roof is Tennessee Williams' Pulitzer prize winning play that has played Broadway for over five years. Burl Ives comes through with another good job of acting as he plays the father of Paul Newman and as the owner of a large cotton plantation in the deep south.

Paul Newman is tops in performing as he plays the part of a broken down football player and the brother of Jack Carson. Everyone who sees *Cat on a Hot Tin Roof*, will say that this is one of the better movies ever to come out of Hollywood.

Saturday the Morehead theatre is playing a double feature starring Dean Martin and Jerry Lewis in both of them. These movies: *You're Never Too Young*, and *Artists and Models* are two of the best Martin and Lewis pictures that they made before they both decided to split up and do singles.

At the City theatre starting Sunday and playing for four days is *The Hunters*, starring Robert Mitchum, Robert Wagner, May Britt, Richard Egan and Lee Phillips. Playing Thursday and Friday at the City theatre is *Attila*, starring Anthony Quinn and Sophia Loren. The story of Attila, the Hun, one of the most savage and blood-thirsty power figures in the annals of time, is told in Technicolor against a vast canvas of epic-making events.

# Traffic Study Reveals Most Victims are Male

Madison, Wis. (AP)—A study of the first 400 traffic deaths in Wisconsin this year shows that 79 per cent of the victims were male.

Fifty-nine of the 84 female victims were pedestrians, while the 316 male victims included only 56 pedestrians.

Of the male victims, 173 were driving motor vehicles, 81 were passengers and six were bicycle riders. Only 16 of the female victims were drivers, while nine were passengers.

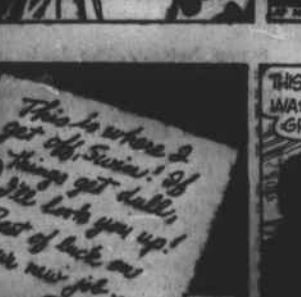
