If you covet a blue ribbon at the state fair, begin with a recipe that has a winning personality. This is pear honey, a syrupy jam with a wonderfully fresh flavor.

You'll really think those dollars are made of rubber when you shop at Colonial and A&P in Beaufort and Morehead City this weekend.

Your \$5 bill at Colonial will buy three cans of pork and beans, two cans of cream corn, four 10-ounce packages of frozen baby limas or green peas; four 10-ounce packages of spinach, 6 pounds of home-grown collards, 5-pound ham (shank portion), a dozen ears of corn and two cans of hominy.

At A&P you can fill your market basket for \$5 with a 4-pound pork roast, 10-pound bag of Irish potatoes, 2 pounds of Bartlett pears, 1 pound Red Circle Coffee, two 16-ounce cans of apple sauce, 4-pound bag apples, 8-ounce package cocoa, orange chiffon cake and Jane Parker apple pie.

A ham dinner with collards would taste good this weekend. You can make up a dollar-saving shopping list to suit your family by referring to the food ads in this section.

If you'd like to have something different and delicious on your pantry shelf this winter, why not try pear honey? Bartlett pears are on the market now.

Pear honey is a syrupy jam with a wonderfully fresh flavor.

**Pear Honey**  
Ingredients: 4 cups chopped pears, ¼ cup orange juice, 3 cups sugar, ¼ teaspoon salt, 3 tablespoons lemon juice, 1 teaspoon grated orange rind.

Method: Use firm-ripe Bartlett pears; core and knife-chop into ¼- to ½-inch pieces; measure 4 cups, packing down. Put pears and orange juice in a medium-sized kettle; boil gently for 5 minutes.

Add sugar, salt and lemon juice; boil rapidly until pears have a transparent look—about 20 minutes; the syrup will be no thicker than warm honey. Skim off foam. Stir in grated orange rind. Pour into hot sterilized jars; seal at once with regular home canning caps. Makes 3 to 4 one-half pint jars. Store in a cool dry place.
