If you'd like to have something different and delicious on your pantry shelf this winter, why not try pear honey? Bartlett pears are on the market now.

Pear honey is a syrupy jam with a wonderfully fresh flavor.

Pear Honey

Ingredients: 4 cups chopped pears 4 cups arange titles 2 cups

Ingredients: 4 cups chopped pears, & cup orange juice, 3 cups sugar, '4 teaspoon salt, 3 table-spoons lemon juice, 1 teaspoon grated orange rind.

Method: life firm ripe Bartlett pears, core and knife-chopinto 2 to 4 finch pieces; measure 4 cups, packing down. Put pears and orange juice in a medium-sized kettle; boil gently for 5 minutes.

5 minutes. Add sugar, salt and lemon juloe; boil rapidly until pears have a transparent look — about 20 minutes; the syrup will be no thicker

than warm honey. Skim off foam.

Stir in grated erange rind. Pour boiling hot into half-pint jars; seel at once with regular home canning caps. Makes 3 to 4 one-half pint jurs. Store in a cold dry place.

Kitchen Cue: Add a beaspoon of sugar to each quart of water when boiling corn on the cob. This improves the flavor.
