How Wise Housewives Fill Market Basket on Budget



Minestrone as main dish. Add a can of tomatoes and extra seasonings to this Italian vegetable soup and serve with french bread.

The leading food stores are dishing up some splendid values for October. At both Colonial and A&P, housewives are finding that not only in the food line, but the house-keeping line—soap, powders, soap, cleansers, etc.—they can make their dollars go farther.

As for the food items, a \$5 bill this week at A&P will buy two Pillsbury cake mixes (your choice from nine flavors), two 6-ounce packages of cheese slices, six No. 2 cans tomato soup, 46-ounce can of Dole pineapple juice, 4-pound chuck roast, eight glazed donuts, and a 6-ounce package of Excelsior frozen beef sandwich steaks.

At Colonial, \$5 will fill your rolling market basket this weekend with three 16-ounce cans of Armour corned-beef hash, four 8-ounce meat pies, 2 pounds fresh green string beans, 4 pounds cabbage, 2 stalks Pascal celery and 3 pounds of round boneless steak.

Change? You bet. Six cents. You can make out your own shopping list to fit your household budget by referring to the food ads in this section.

Seeing canned tomatoes among the values this week reminds me of a variation possible with canned minestrone, that luscious Italian vegetable soup. With a few home-kitchen touches, the soup can serve as a main course for lunch.

Crusty french bread, lavished with garlic butter and heated, is a perfect combination with the soup.

Minestrone Plus Ingredients: 1 can (10 1/2 ounces) condensed minestrone, water, 1 can (10 ounces) tomatoes, 1/2 teaspoon salt, pepper, 1 teaspoon sugar, minced fresh or dried basil, grated Parmesan or Romano cheese.

Method: Turn minestrone into a medium-sized saucepan; fill the soup can with water and add. Mix in the tomatoes, including the juice, salt, pepper to taste and the sugar. Heat slowly, stirring several times, to boiling; simmer 5 to 10 minutes (or longer) to develop flavors, adding basil to taste a few minutes before serving. Accompany the soup with the grated cheese.

Kitchen Cue: Sprinkling salt into the water in which you are washing fresh vegetables will bring any worms or insects out on the run, thus making your task easier.
