

Chairman Reports on 1958 Migrant Ministry Program

The Rev. Al Daniel, chairman of the County Ministers Association migrant ministry committee, has reported on the 1958 migrant ministry in the county.

Cash donations received from county churches to finance the program totaled \$483.98; sent to the North Carolina Council of Churches for minister's services, \$325; spent in the county for room rent for the minister, promotional materials and equipment, \$120.35; balance on hand to finish this year and begin next year's work, \$38.63.

The minister working with the migrants last summer was the Rev. Marshall Gilmore.

Among the recommendations made for next year were the following:

- Direct and personal contact with all growers and a representa-

tive number of them put on the migrant ministry committee

- More local agencies and Negro ministers contacted personally before the minister arrives and encourage them to work in the program
- More equipment made available, such as projectors, athletic equipment, games, toys, films, etc.
- Have list of volunteer helpers before minister arrives
- If possible, have a part-time helper or secretary for the migrant minister

Mr. Daniel expressed his thanks to committee members for their cooperation this year.

The first meeting, to plan the 1959 migrant ministry program, will be held at 4 p.m. Feb. 20, in the educational building of Ann Street Church, Beaufort.

Climaxing the program in each Convocation will be an address by Bishop Wright.
