NORTH CAROLINA STATUTES

Machinery Act.

Sec. 901. (G. S. 105-307). Duty to List; Penalty for failure.

In addition to all other penalties prescribed by law, any person, firm or corporation whose duty it shall be to list any poll or property, real or personal, who willfully falls or refuses to list the same within the time allowed by law, or who removes or conceals property for the purpose of evading taxation, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor punishable by fine not to exceed fifty dollars (\$50.00) or imprisonment not to exceed irty days.

### POLL TAXES

All men subject to Poll Taxes, as well as all property owners, real or personal, must list to avoid penalties which will positively be charged.

### NO LISTING BY TELEPHONE

The listing blank MUST he signed by the owner or an authorized agent. NO LISTINGS WILL BE ACCEPTED BY PHONE.




