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## Agricultural News Notes

### THE GRANGE

North Carolina farmers and farm women have long since felt the need of a national fraternal farm organization. The Alliance and Farmers' Union at different periods received much backing from the people in this State. Each served its day, did much good and passed off the stage, leaving the people of this state with very little farm organization.

At a recent State Farmers Convention in Raleigh several outstanding men and women were appointed on a committee to study farm organizations now in existence and to recommend what action the people of this state should take in organizing, and as to whether they would go into an already organized order or set up a new organization. This committee recommended that the Grange, Order of Patrons of the Husbandry, be invited to establish units in this state in which farmers, farm women and boys and girls could all have membership. The recommendation was adopted.

The Grange is the largest farm organization in America, and the only farm fraternity in the world. It was founded sixty-six years ago, and the organization has been more prosperous during the last decade than ever before in its long period of life. In spite of the prevailing condition throughout the country approximately 300 new subordinate units have been organized since October 1, 1931. The Grange covers 30 states, reaching all the way from Maine to California, and as far north as Washington and Minnesota.

In November this great organization will hold a National meeting in Winston-Salem, N. C. At this meeting will gather representatives from each of the thirty states in which there are Grange organizations, and this will probably be the largest farm gathering ever held in North Carolina.

## ARE MITCHELL AND YANCEY INTERESTED IN GRANGE?

A large majority of the counties in North Carolina have already organized Grange units, and have made much progress in this work. The farm papers have had much to say about the nature of the work and the benefits to be derived from the Grange. Community leaders in Mitchell and Yancey counties have at various times expressed an interest in the organization and some have said that they think it would fit in well here with the local program for agricultural improvement. It has been suggested that the Master of North Carolina Grange should be invited to come here and address the people in both Mitchell and Yancey on the Grange. W. Kerr Scott, an able speaker and one of the leading farmers in the state is Master of the North Carolina Grange. He has staid his willingness to come here for two engagements, one in Bakersville and the other at Burnsville. His coming should give local people an opportunity to decide whether they wish to organize and to become a part of the largest and one of the oldest farm organizations in America.

The county agent will be glad to discuss this work with any who are interested in deciding what to do about promoting Grange work in either Yancey or Mitchell county at this time. Should we invite Mr. Scott to come here, and if so, when? EXPERIMENT STATION FIELD DAY. The annual Field Day at the Mountain Branch Experiment Station near Swannanoa on Highway No. 10 will be held this year on August 18. A few farmers from these two counties attended this meeting last year. The attendance should be much larger this year. Contests in judging livestock and judging legume plants will be held. An opportunity will be given to inspect the field experimental plots, the dairy herd and the poultry farm. Keep this meeting in mind and plan to go to Swannanoa on August 18.

## CHEAPER POWER RATES BEING DISCUSSED.

Raleigh.—While only one electric power company doing business in North Carolina has voluntarily reduced its rates especially to small consumers such as home owners and small individual users, the State Corporation Commission is hopeful that other power companies will do likewise and believe that they will, Commissioner Stanley Winborne said. The commission has requested all power companies doing business in the state to submit complete statements with regard to their rates, earnings and investments with a view to making a survey and possibly revisions.

"The power companies are co-operating with us to the fullest extent and we are getting in these statements every day so that within a few weeks we hope to have all the facts before us," Winborne said. "One fact is agreed upon—that is that all power companies have more power to sell than they are selling, with the result that it is going to waste and doing no one any good. Our contention is that the companies will eventually sell more power than they now are, if they will reduce their rates and thus get greater volume of business.

"There is no doubt that many people simply cannot afford to use electricity either for lighting their home or in business at the rates now being charged by some companies and that they must either reduce their rates to a point where people are able to use it or else go out of business. Our contention is that they had better reduce their rates and increase their volume rather than go out of business or go bankrupt."

Commissioner Winborne agreed that thousands of people who formerly used electricity in their homes are now returning to the use of kerosene lamps and that more will do so unless electric rates are brought down to a more reasonable basis, especially for the smaller users of electricity who so far have paid the highest prices for it.

Unless the power companies make some real reductions in their rates to users, they can expect some drastic legislation, it is agreed here.
