North Carolina farmers and farm women have long since felt the need of a social and fraternal farm organization. Raleigh.—While only one electric power company doing business in North Carolina has voluntarily reduced its rates especially to small consumers such as home owners and small individual users, the State Corporation Commission is hopeful that other power companies will do likewise and believe that they will, Commissioner Stanley Wilhopenes and the state of the commissioner Stanley Wilhopenes and the state of the state o

Corporation Commission is hopeful that other power companies will do likewise and believe that they will, Commissioner Staniey Winbornesaid. The commissione has requested all power companies doing business in the state to submit complete statements with regard to their rates, earning and investments with a view to making a survey and possibly revisions.

"The power companies are cooperating with us to the follest extent and we are getting in these statements every day so that within a few weeks we hope to have all the lacts before us," Winborne said.

"One fact is agreed upon—that is that all power companies have more power to sell than they are selling, with the result that it is going to waste and doing no one any good. Our contention is that the companies will eventually sell more power and thus make more money than they now are, if they will reduce their rates and thus get greater volume of business.

"There is no doubt that many people simply cannot afford to use electricity either for lighting their home or in business at the rates now being charged by some companies and that they must either reduce their rates to a point where people can afford to use it or else go out of business. Our contention is that they had better reduce their rates and increase their volume rather than go out of business or go bankrupt."
