



Friends and allies of the United States in many lands will become familiar with the American eagle symbol, inset above, new label of food exported from this country to other nations under the war time Food for Freedom program. The emblem was designed by Walt Disney in recognition of the vital part American food is playing on the battle fronts abroad and at home. It is available for voluntary use by food packers of North Carolina and other states, according to the USDA War Board at State College. The emblem shows the American Eagle beating off a bombing plane's attack on a cargo vessel. The four stars in the background represent the four freedoms as outlined in the Atlantic charter-freedom of speech and religion, and freedom from fear and want.
