



**Q**—Will the Senate continue the investigation into the appointment or nomination of Mr. Allen Whitfield to be a member of the Atomic Energy Commission?  
**A**—Likely not. Mr. Whitfield withdrew his name before final action was taken, so he is no longer a contender for the post. Some members of the investigating committee were not pleased with Mr. Whitfield's given reasons for withdrawing his name. For instance Whitfield said some questions asked him were of an extraordinary nature that would involve a question of breach of legal ethics. Some would like to have the public judge whether they would so involve, but the majority likely will now let the matter drop.  
**Q**—Two years ago I applied for disability compensation, but I never kept the appointment for physical examination with Veterans Administration. Can I still file my application?  
**A**—Yes, you can file a new application. If approved, payments would begin as of date of the new application, not the old one.  
**Q**—How many states were territories before admittance into the Union?  
**A**—Twenty-eight. Seven were admitted without having been territories.  
**Q**—Can you tell me what state has the smallest legislature?  
**A**—Nebraska. It has a unicameral legislature of one House consisting of 43 members. One of our smaller states has the largest legislature, New Hampshire, with a population of about 600,000, has a senate with 24 members and a House with 399 members.  
**Q**—When was the last impeachment charge made against a cabinet officer?  
**A**—Against Andrew Mellon, Secretary of the Treasury in the Harding, Coolidge and Hoover administrations. The House Judiciary Committee heard the charge in 1932, but before final action was taken, Mr. Mellon resigned.


