Washington, D. C.: Renewed efforts to have February recognized nationally as American History Month in order to stimulate greater study of American History were urged today by Mrs. Frederic A. Groves, President General, Daughters of the American Revolution.

"Many states," Mrs. Groves said, "have already proclaimed February as American History Month and have called for special observance in schools, colleges, churches and public gatherings. Most of the proclamations were secured through the efforts of state members of the National Society, Daughters of the American Revolution.

"Studies made by our armed forces give sound factual evidence of the value of the teaching of American History in stimulating patriotism.

"For this reason," Mrs. Groves said, "members of the National

Society, Daughters of the American Revolution, are supporting the measure introduced in this Congress by representative Jenkins of Ohio to have the month recognized as American History Month. The resolution has been referred to the House Judiciary Committee.

"Our purpose in urging the observance of American History Month is summed up in the words of Abraham Lincoln, who urged that every man receive at least a moderate education and thereby be enabled to read the histories of his own and other countries, by which he may duly appreciate the value of our free institutions."

"And of course George Washington had much the same thing to say in his Farewell Address, when he admonished us:

"Promote, then, as an object of primary importance, institutions for the general diffusion of knowledge, in proportion as the struc-

**NEW COMPOUND AID FOR ULCERS**

The use of a new nutritional compound in the control of peptic ulcers is giving science a clue to one of its most puzzling questions, "What really causes ulcers?"

Newly introduced to this country after extensive clinical trials both in Europe and in the United States, the compound called Escul apparently exerts its healing effects by supplying nutritional factors missing in ulcer patients.

This theory on the cause of ulcers is a far cry from all other reasons advanced for the occurrence of ulcers. Among those previously advanced ideas were nervous tension, and hyperacidity.

With the first successes of Escul, however, it was discovered the new compound worked even when a high degree of acidity was present in the ulcer patient, according to American doctors conducting clinical studies. Nervous tension as the sole cause of ulcers has been disputed in medical circles for years.

The new compound was developed after Danish scientists observed that nutritional factors prevented and cured gizzard ulcers in chickens. Human clinical work, conducted by Prof. Ejner Jarlov, Chief of Medicine at the University of Copenhagen, Denmark led to the development of the compound by Yorktown Products Corporation of New York which is now introducing the compound on a prescription basis in this country.

"In this month, too, Massachusetts, Oregon, and Arizona were admitted to the union.

The history of our own nation under God is the history of a people who developed the finest system of government ever yet devised by man. This Republic will be ours just so long as we know it, love it and cherish it."
