



Combine beef, salt, pepper and Ac'cent. Form 12 thin, round patties, about 4 inches in diameter. Broil over charcoal.

Tip: If broiling hamburgers over charcoal, a flat wire toaster is convenient. It makes turning easier and prevents squashing of burgers. Serve any left-over French fried onions with the meal . . . nice to have a few extra cans on hand. They make wenderful snacks to nibble on while the food is being cooked.
