Ellen Hudgins is in Spruce Pine Community Hospital where she underwent surgery Sunday, June 6.

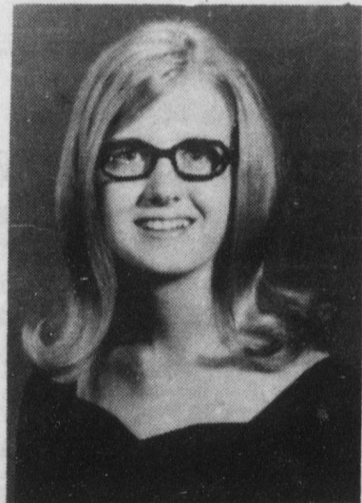
Jay Autrey, who has been in the Mission Hospital in Asheville is back home again and doing fine.

Nancy Randolph Engaged

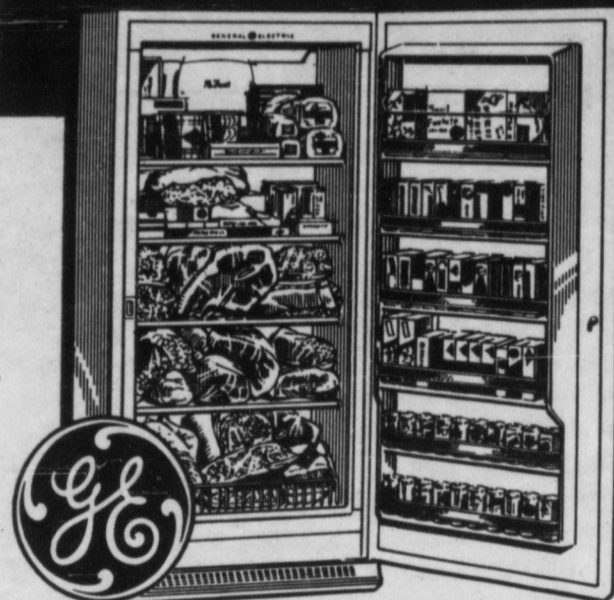

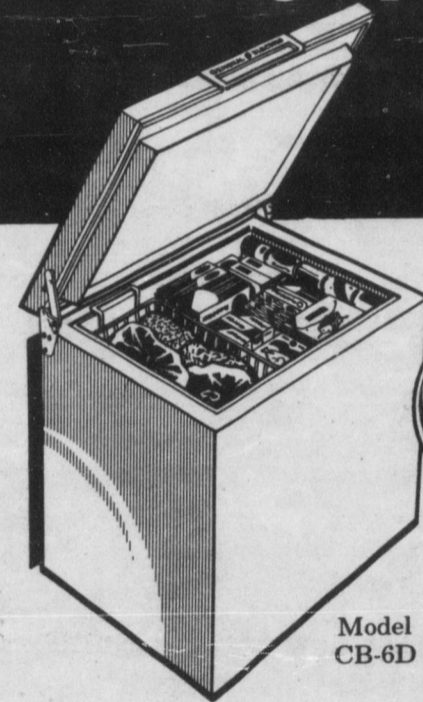
