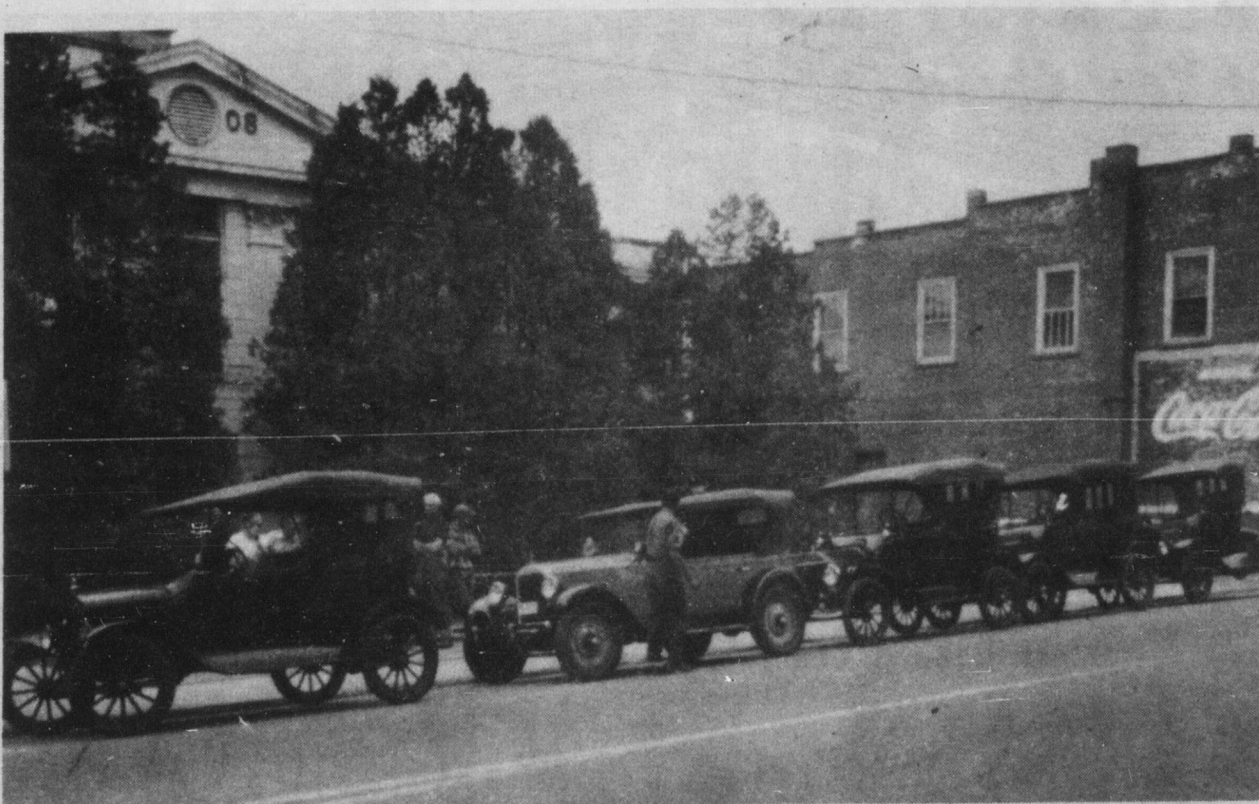
Deadline Near

Mr. Thurman Leatherwood, State Revenue Collector, urges all taxpayers to procure State privilege licenses before July 1, 1971.

According to Mr. Leatherwood, timely applications for licenses, together with the correct remittance, should be mailed to the North Carolina Department of Revenue, Raleigh, North Carolina, or be submitted to the local State Revenue office. He advises that the penalty for failure to comply will be 5% for each delinquent month, or fraction thereof.
