special, very striking views of street scenes in Paris and Germany," he said. "Some are landscapes in Bavaria or elsewhere. Some are still lifes of flowers. There is such variety that everyone will see something to please their taste in art."

To make the event a special one, Albert will serve homemade apfelstrudel and coffee at the Open House/Art Show. The paintings, which are too many to hang individually will be arranged throughout the restaurant so that guests can view and enjoy them at their leisure while sampling this delicious German dessert which is a specialty at Albert's.

Everyone is invited to come Sunday afternoon and enjoy a unique outing—and perhaps get a head start on Christmas gift-giving for a very special person.
