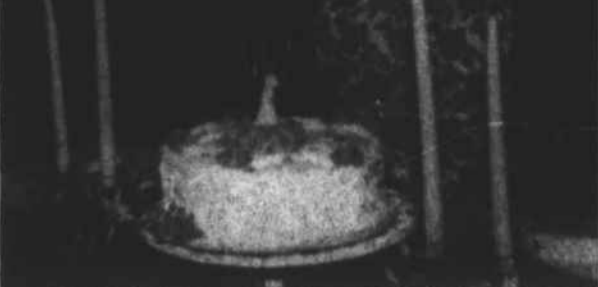

Jupiter, The Giant Planet

Special To The Scout

At present Jupiter and Saturn are evening stars. However, they are not stars but planets. The word planet means wandering star, rather it was so used by the ancients. Jupiter and Saturn are easily seen in the southwestern sky after dark these evenings. Saturn is less brilliant than Jupiter because it is somewhat smaller and almost twice as far away as Jupiter. In the telescope, Saturn is an exceedingly beautiful object. Be sure to get a look at it if you have access to a telescope. Jupiter and its four larger moons form a picture that is really enthralling, and the picture changes from night to night.

Jupiter is more massive than all the other planets together. Its mean diameter is 88,600 miles, slightly more than eleven times the diameter of the earth. It is about one tenth the size of the sun and requires 12 of our years to make one revolution of its orbit. Its average distance from the sun is 483 million miles. Hence it receives 30 times less heat and light from the sun than that received by the earth. Its surface temperature is very low -- 210 degrees Fahrenheit below zero.

Jupiter outshines any other planet except the earth's twin sister, Venus. At this writing Venus is lost in the light of the sun. In a few days it will appear in the west just after sunset and will be the most brilliant object in the sky except the sun and moon. Most people do not know that Mercury and Venus go through phases like our moon. That is because they are inside of the earth's orbit. All other planets are outside the earth's orbit and so do not go through these changes of surface appearance. Using a power of 50 on a moderate sized telescope the disc of Jupiter will appear about the same size as the full moon to the unaided eye. It is known to have 12 moons four of which may be seen with a power of 10. These four larger satellites were first seen by Galileo with his "optick tube" in the year 1610. In the telescope they form a beautiful picture and change from night to night. All four cannot be seen every night due to the fact that they are constantly moving and thus one or two may be hidden behind the planet or passing in front of it. In the latter case there is an eclipse of the sun taking place; and if you have sufficient power you will see a dark, round spot on the face of the planet.
