**Catholic  
Father Is  
Transferred**

Revered James J. Wilmes, director of Plus XII Pastoral Center in Clay County, has announced his transfer to new duties in Cincinnati, Ohio. To his friends in six WNC Counties, he is known as "Father Jim". He spent four years in Cherokee County as associate pastor of St. William's and Immaculate Heart Chapels. During this time, he also helped redecorate Fontana's Chapel, and establish Good Shepherd Chapel in Hayesville and Sacred Heart Chapel in Robbinsville.

During the past 2 years, besides teaching at the Buck Creek Pastoral Center, he has served as pastor of St. Francis of Assis Church in Franklin, caring as well for missions in Bryson City, Sylva, Cherokee and Cullowhee. In Cherokee he obtained the necessary permissions from the Tribal Council to build a new chapel large enough to serve 300. The site and plans are almost complete and construction will begin soon. In Cullowhee, Christ the King Newman Center has been set up to offer students of all creeds a homelike atmosphere to read and relax, as well to pray in a small separate chapel.

Father Wilmes expressed "deep regrets leaving the many friends who God has given him the past 6 years, but trusts to meet them again sometime." He expressed the hope that any Western Carolinians passing thru Cincinnati would take time to visit with him at the headquarters of the Glenmary Missioners in Glendale, a suburb 15 miles from Cincinnati. His new address after August 15 is Glenmary Missioners, Cincinnati, 46, Ohio.

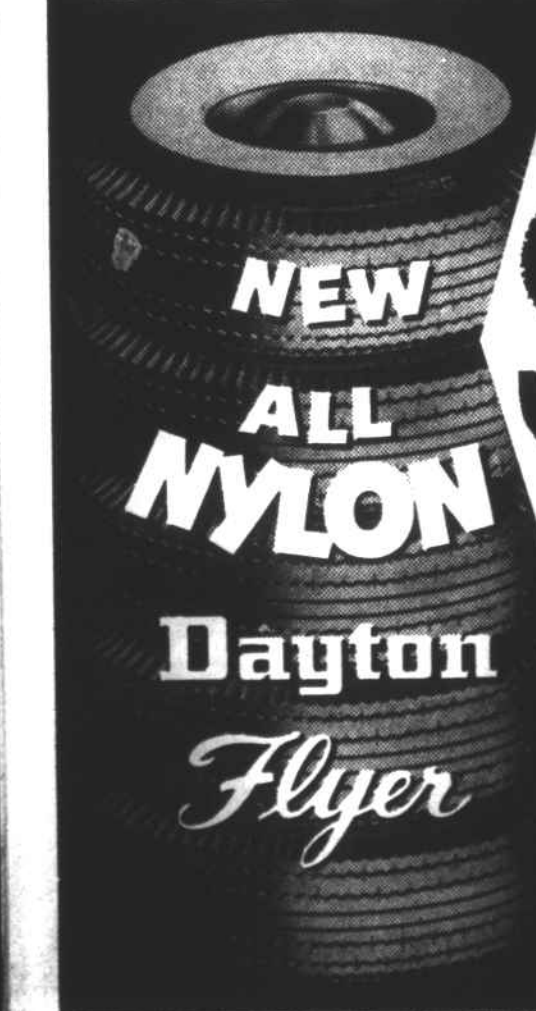
