

# WCC To Offer Extension Courses At Murphy School

**CULLOWHEE**—Western Carolina College will conduct four extension courses during the fall quarter, three at David Millard Junior High School in Asheville, and one at Murphy Elementary School.

Beginning Thursday, Sept. 6, Mental Hygiene will be taught in Murphy by Dr. John McGeever and in Asheville by Dr. Stanton Proctor. This course deals with problems of personality maladjustment among children, causes and corrective procedures.

Also on Thursdays, Mrs. C. A. Hoyle will teach a course in Phonetics at the Asheville school, dealing with the theory and practice of correct speech sounds.

On Tuesday, Sept. 11, Dr.

Guy Burchfield will begin a course in elementary school curriculum. This work is designed to examine methods and techniques of school improvement through the use of criteria and standards developed by accrediting agencies, and is open to graduate students only. The others are open to both graduate and advanced undergraduates.

There will be eleven class meetings in each course, from 6:30 to 9:30 p.m. on the days indicated, and each course carries three quarter hours of college credit.

## Power Board Representative Attends Institute

Mrs. Beryl Fulton, Customer Relations Representative of the Murphy Power Board is now attending the Personnel Training Institute being held in Chattanooga, Tennessee, by the Tennessee Valley Authority.

The purpose of the Institute is to present new ideas and information about power use activities as they relate to improved customer service. Those attending the training sessions are from approximately 40 different municipal and cooperative distributors of TVA electricity.

The program consists of five sessions of one week each month from June through Oct. After the initial orientation program, the week-long schools includes such subjects as commercial and residential lighting, adequate wiring, advertising, public relations, electric heating and cooling, commercial cooking and water heating, and rural electrification.

TVA personnel are assisted in covering the subjects by specialists from related businesses and industry.

"We are always looking for ways to improve our customer's electric service," John H. Bayless, Manager of the electric system, said. "This Training Institute has been especially helpful. We want to assist all our consumers in planning for a better, more efficient use of low cost electricity."

John H. Bayless said that free electrical planning services are available to all of the electric system's consumers.

Last week, Mrs. Fulton attended a work shop on public relations. The next session, September 17, will cover electric heating, commercial cooking and air conditioning.
