low a figure for a County,
having between 17 and 18

Lone Victor For Democrats

Cherokee County Republicans swept to an overwhelming victory in Tuesday's General Election, taking every county office with the exception of the incumbent Democrat candidate for county commisioner in districtone, W. T. Moore of Andrews, running for re-election, was the only Democrat to be elected to a county office.

Democrat W. Frank Forsyth of Murphy won re-election to the N. C. State Senate from the 33rd District over Rev. C. C. Welch, Republican from Franklin.

Congressman Roy A. Tay-lor won easily over Republican hopeful Robert Brown for the 11th District's U.S. House of Representatives.

In Cherokee County incumbent Republican Ed Graves led his party's ticket to victory with 4,168 votes to the Democrat Paul Sudderth's 3,304. All totals are unofficial until the Board of Elections meets Thursday, Nov. 8.

Republican Sheriff Claude Anderson, seeking his third term, was re-elected by 513 votes over Democrat hope-ful Donald Anderson.

Herman H. West, Republi-can member of the N. C. House of Representatives during the 1961 session, won re-election over Democrat Mrs. Mary Faye Brumby. In the three commissioner

districts, Republican gained control as Dr. W. A. Hoover of Murphy and Lester Cole, Route 2, Culberson, were elected, Hoover defeated J. H. Duncan in district two, while Cole won out over Rev. W. D. Graham in district W. T. Moore, by the narrow

margin of 66 votes, defeated Republican Carlyle Matheson for county commissioner in

bent Democrat Herman Edwards for judge of record-er's court, while Don Ram-sey won over incumbent Democrat James C. Howse for clerk of Superior Court, I. C. Townson, seeking reelection, beat Dr. George F. Size for coroner.
