C., for the purpose of examining and reviewing the tax list of each township for the current year and shall hear any and all taxpayers who own or control taxable property assessed for taxation in the county, with respect to the valuation of all property in the county and to correct any errors appearing on the abstracts, and for the transaction of any other business which may come before the board in compliance with the Machinery

This is the only time in which the Commissioners have the authority to change the valuation of real estate.
