Answer: No, we are not to keep the ceremonies of the Old Law, When Christ died on the cross He fulfilledor completed this law of ordinances that was against us (Col. 2:14), and upon His death set in effect His own law. (Heb. 9:15-17).

We are distinctly told that we are not to be judged of men concerning feastdays, new moons, or sabbath days. (Col. 2:16). We are told to assemble
