

Verdicts Of Superior Court Cass Cases Listed

MURPHY-Cherokee County civil and criminal term of Superior Court for week of July 29, 1968, was held with the Honorable George B. Patton, Resident Judge of the Thirtieth Judicial District, present and presiding.

Cases #1193, #1194, #1195 State - vs - Donald Long, Breaking, Entering, and Larceny; The defendant plead guilty as charged. On the first charge the defendant was sentenced to six months. On the second and third charges he was sentenced to a term of twelve months in each. Second and third sentences were suspended for five years with defendant on probation following first sentence.

Cases #1198, #1199, #2000, State - vs - James L. Gibby, Breaking, Entering, and Larceny; Pled guilty. Sentenced six months on first charge, and sentenced to twelve months each on second and third charges. Twelve months sentences are suspended for five years.

Case #2005 State - vs - Joe Allen Moore, Breaking, Entering, Larceny; Pled guilty. Sentenced to six months on charge of larceny. On charge of breaking and entering, de-

endant sentenced to 12 months. This sentence to begin at the expiration of sentence on count of larceny of property of value of less than \$200.

Case #2007, State - vs - Charles D. Johnson, Larceny of Automobile; Pled guilty. Sentenced to work under the supervision of State Prison Department for a term of twelve months.

Case #2008, State - vs - Wilson Murdock, Larceny of Automobile; Pled guilty. Sentenced to twelve months and assigned to do work under supervision of State Prison Department.

State - vs - Louvenia McCombs, Assault; Sentenced to six months. Sentence suspended for a period of three years. Pistol involved in this case is condemned and confiscated and M. G. Crawford is ordered to destroy weapon and exhibit remains in open court.

Charles Curtis Griggs, vs - Donna Lee Segrest Griggs; Divorce granted.

Case #1189, State - vs - Herbert Fuller Whitford, Escape Pled guilty. Sentenced to six months with sentence to begin at expiration of other sentences.

Case #1190 State - vs - Robert Russell, Escape; Pled guilty. Sentenced to nine months to begin at expiration of present sentence.

Case #1192, State - vs - Benny Lamar Weaver, Escape. Pled guilty. Sentence to nine months. The nine months sentence is to begin at expiration of present sentence.

Case #2017, State - vs - Jimmy Stiles, Escape; Pled guilty. Sentenced to six months to begin at expiration of present sentence.

Case #2018 State - vs - Roy Elbert Covil, Escape; Pled guilty. Sentenced to nine months with sentence to begin at expiration of present sentence.

Case #2004 State - vs - David Pulliam, Breaking, Entering, and Larceny, and Receiving; Pled guilty. On count of receiving, state takes a nol pros with leave. Sentenced to not less than twelve months nor more than eighteen months. Sentence is suspended for three years.

Case #2010, State - vs - Johnny Pendergrass, breaking, Entering, and Larceny, and Receiving; Pled guilty. On count of receiving, state takes a nol pros with leave. Sentenced to not less than twelve months nor more than eighteen months. Sentence is suspended for three years.

Cases #1196, #2001, #2002, #2003, #2004, Charles E. Bryant, Eddie Joe Crisp, James E. Gladson, James Patrick Hogan, Lewis Voyles; Breaking, Entering, and Larceny; All boys entered a plea of guilty, and were sentenced to 24 months with sentence suspended for three years upon the following conditions: 1) That they pay costs; 2) That they pay into office of Clerk of Court the sum of \$200 for use and benefit of county schools; 3) Be of good behavior and not violate any

criminal laws of the state of North Carolina; 4) That they not associate with each other unless at school or at place of employment; 5) That they apply themselves to some gainful occupation unless they decide to enter school and if re-enter school they must apply themselves diligently to studies and lead every effort toward making good students.

All other conditions contained in the usual probationary judgement are made a part and parcel hereof.

Case #1163 State - vs - Katrina Elizabeth Jackson, Involuntary manslaughter; defendant entered a plea of Nolo Contendere. Since it appeared that satisfactory settlement has been made and the fact that defendant is only seventeen years old, the defendant is sentenced to not
