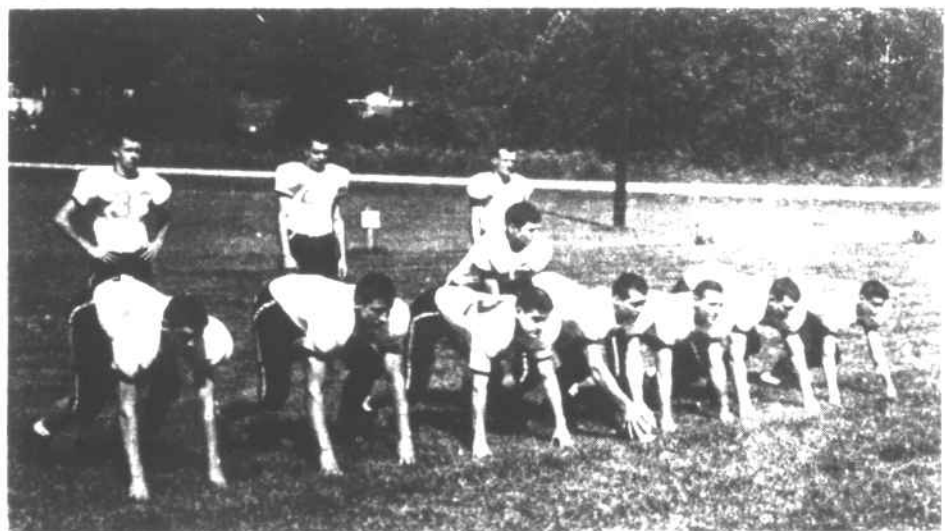
## Three Area Games On Tap County Football Teams Open Season On Home Fields This Friday Night

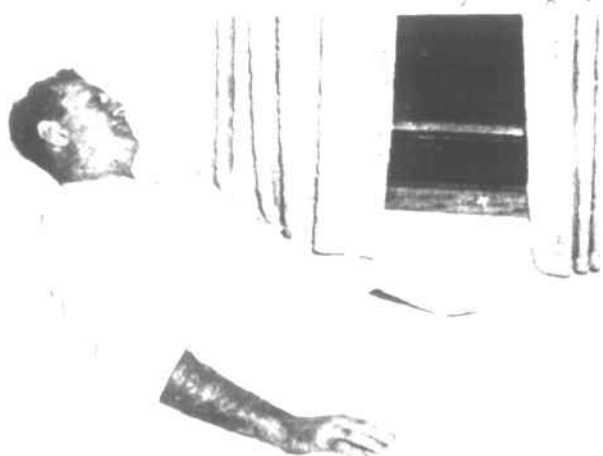
