Miss Wheeler also reported on the Community Development meeting she attended in Asheville.

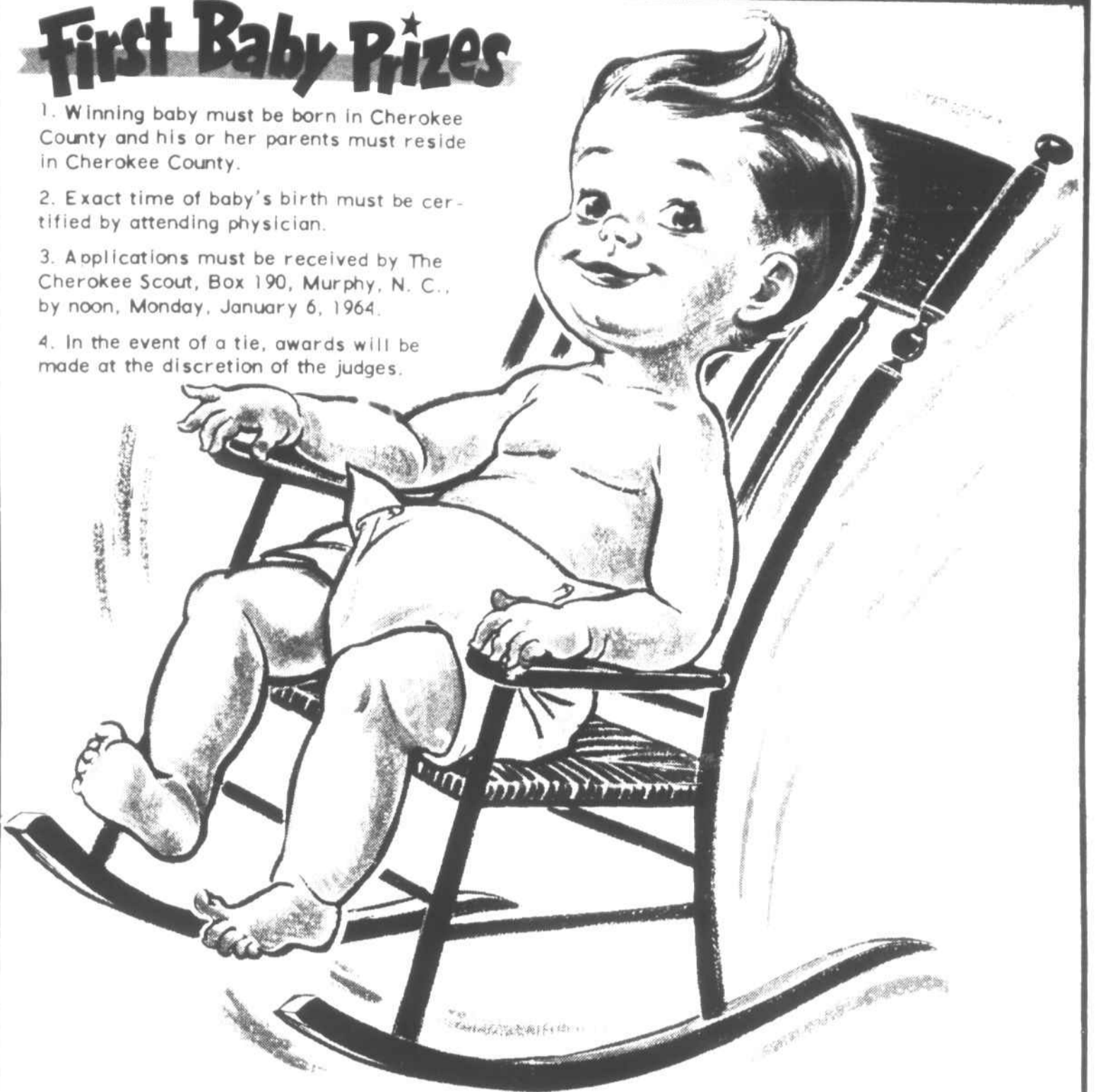
