**NOTICE TO TAXPAYERS MEETING OF THE CHEROKEE COUNTY Board Of Equalization And Review**  
The Cherokee County Board Of Commissioners WILL SIT AS A BOARD OF EQUALIZATION AND REVIEW ON **Wednesday, March 25 FROM 9:00 A.M. - 4:00 P.M.**  
The Board of Equalization and Review will meet at the Commissioners' Office in the Courthouse in Murphy for the purpose of examining and reviewing the tax list of each township for the current year. A hearing will be granted to any taxpayer who has a valid reason why he believes an adjustment is necessary on his appraisal, if that person makes a written application for a hearing and mails or brings this written application to the Cherokee County Tax Supervisor's Office, Cherokee County Courthouse, Murphy, N. C. prior to March 25. After making the written application, the applicant must appear before the Board on March 25 for his hearing and for the transaction of any other business which may come before the Board in compliance with the Machinery Act.  
This is the only time in which the Commissioners have the authority to change the valuation of real estate.
