ANSWER: No, it does not. The Bible plainly teaches that a person will be in the same condition at the judgement as he is when he departs from this world. (Lk. 16:26)


The Bible does speak of a place called Hades, an unknown or hidden place where the soul goes at death to await the judgement (Lk. 16; Acts 2:31).




