Changes in the method of electing county ASC committees and in the length of their term of office has been announced by the USDA. The legislation authorizing the changes was recently approved by Congress and was signed by President Joynson

on August 31st. Under the new bill, three major changes relating to the election of ASC county com-

mittees were authorized. These changes: (1) to establish a three - year staggered term of office for the county committeemen instead of the existing one-year term; (2) provide that a county committeeman may not serve more than three consecutive terms. Previously there was no limitation on the number of terms committeemen could serve; (3) provide for the election of county committeemen by all community committeemen at the county convention rather than by the chairman of each community committee in the county.

The new law, shich does not apply to 1964 committee elections, becomes effective for elections held after January
