## Junaluska Road Dedicated Despite Rainy Weather

ANDREWS - Despite rainy weather, the dedication of the new Junaluska Road on Wednesday, Nov. 25, was a great occasion for Mayor P. B. Ferebee and many others.

The weather kept Governor Terry Sanford, Governor-elect Dan Moore, and other state officials in Raleigh, who had planned to fly here, from attending. But some 50 persons, including state and federal representatives, who came by car, were on hand to

see Representative Roy A. Taylor cut the red ribbon stretched across the road way, marking the official opening of the new Junaluska Road.

Running from a few miles above Andrews, the new road leads across to Aquone and the intersection with the Nantahala - Franklin road letting outsiders see breathtaking scenery through beautiful forests of oak and pine, hemlock and birch, beech and rhododendron.

Andrews citizens have visions of this road's potentiality and they take enormous pride in its resources and technology. They are indeed grateful to Mayor P. B. Ferebee for making this road a reality.

"This will mean much to this section of the state," Ferebee told the group. "It will mean that the people of Macon County will be able to transport their timber to Andrews for the new plant we are opening soon." Ferebee also stated that a whole new scenic and recreational area has been opened up for development and enjoyment by thousands of visitors as well as local people.

J. K. Vessey, Southeastern

Regional Director of U. S. Forest Service from Atlanta announced to the group that his agency was already preparing to develop camping and picnic sites along the route.

"We are ready," Vessey said, "to begin work on a 200 unit camping site just over Junaluska Gap. This is a road that will attract the tourists and will be beautiful in all seasons."

Congressman Taylor paid tribute to Ferebee for his "great perseverance," which made the road possible.

A special committee of the Konnaheeta Club, headed by Mrs. C. S. Freal, president, greeted the ladies present for the dedication at the town hall.

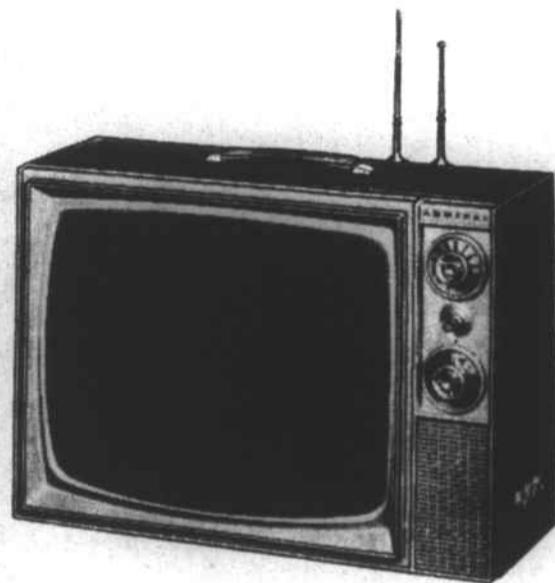
