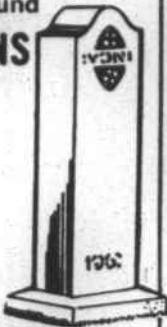




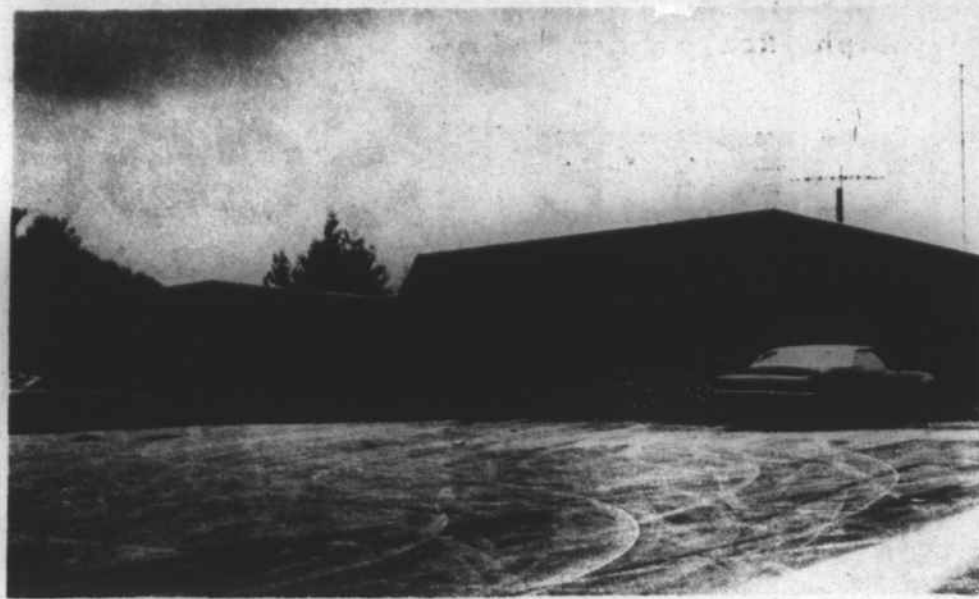

adjacent to Union General Hospital, it houses the offices of Dr. William Ralph Bottoms; Dr. H.D. Prewett, dentist; and Ralph's Pharmacy, operated by pharmacists Ralph Twiggs and Larry Smith.

## Book Sales Slated

Two book fairs are scheduled at Andrews, one on Saturday for the benefit of the elementary school library and one next week at the high school.

The book fair for the elementary school will be held from 9 Saturday morning until noon, in the parking lot of the A&P store. Books to go on sale are suitable for grades 1-6, priced under \$4.

The school library will share in the profits of the sale but it is hoped that many school patrons will buy a book and then donate it to the library.

According to school officials, the library in the elementary school had 5,094 books before the fire last January. It now has only about 80 books.

The book fair at the high school is sponsored by the Beta Club and will run Monday through Friday. It will be held in the school library and will be open to the public.

The high school library will be open from 8 a.m. until 10 p.m. on Monday and from 8 until 4 p.m. the rest of the week.

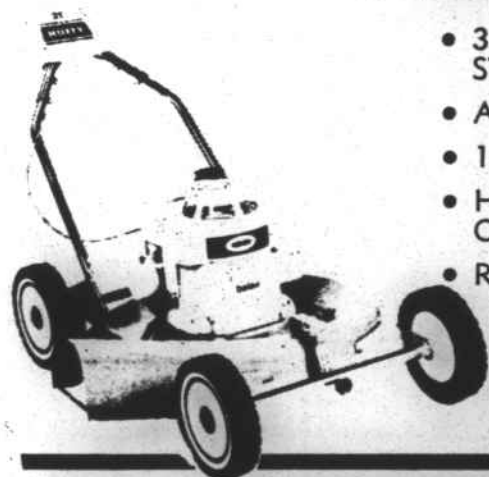
