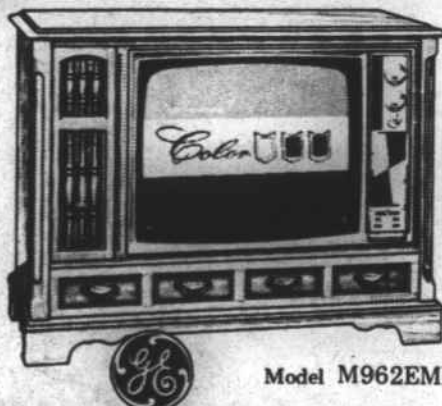

RC&D Interest Hits

Peak In North Carolina

Public interest in actual or proposed Resource Conservation and Development (RC&D) projects has reached a new high mark in North Carolina, it was disclosed today by State Conservationist Jessa L. Hicks of the USDA-Soil Conservation Service.

Of North Carolina's two active RC&D projects, Clay, Cherokee, Graham, Jackson, Macon, and Swain Counties in Planning Region are working on two fronts. Sponsors of the Western Six RC&D Program are pressing for completion of several jobs while working on a long-range plan. This plan will identify and describe many resource developments, which are needed in the region. It will serve as a guide for agencies of government and for private groups and business firms.

Among those active project measures now in the mill are:

- (1) The Chatuge Shores Family Recreation Center.
- (2) Graham County - Robbinsville water supply and flood prevention project on Long Creek.
- (3) Improved drainage and erosion control in Macon County's Iotla Creek valley.
- (4) Bryson City - Swain County municipal and industrial water supply reservoir.
- (5) Solid waste collection and disposal program for Cherokee County.
- (6) Further development of trout production, processing and marketing in the Southern Appalachian region.

Several other project measures are being considered for inclusion in the Project Plan.

The second active project is the three year old North Central Piedmont RC&D in Rockingham, Guilford, Caswell, Alamance, Orange and Chatham Counties.

New applications have been forwarded for the South Central Piedmont area (North Carolina Planning Region "F") covering Iredell, Rowan, Lincoln, Gaston, Cabarrus, Stanley, Mecklenburg and Union Counties, and for the Mid-East RC&D area which covers Planning Region "Q" of Hertford, Bertie, Martin, Pitt and Beaufort Counties. The New River Valley application covering Ashe, Watauga, and Alleghany Counties in North Carolina and Grayson County, Virginia, was found to be in order.

An application is being prepared for 10 Region "R" counties in Eastern North Carolina, including Gates, Currituck, Camden, Pasquotank, Perquimans, Chowan, Washington, Tyrell, Dare and Hyde. Another application is being prepared in Region "E" in Western North Carolina, comprising Caldwell, Burke, Alexander and Catawba Counties.

Meetings are being held in Planning Regions "K" and "L" jointly with Virginia resident on the north side of Kerr Lake;

Clay Courthouse

Mainstream came into the picture. They furnished the labor. The county bought the paint and necessary materials for the clean-up job.

Operation Mainstream first trimmed the trees on the courthouse lawn. They moved to the belfry where they cleaned out three truck loads of pigeon litter. In the weather-beaten, decayed belfry, the pigeons had nested for years. Much of the litter was hauled away; but some of it was given to the Clay Homemakers Extension Clubs who planted flowers on the four corners of the square as part of their beautification project this Summer.

Operation Mainstream has painted all the building inside in nice light colors, which makes it neat and attractive.

Large wooden scaffolds were built. The men made the long tedious climb to repair and paint the belfry and all the wood work on the court house. The brick will not be painted, since the old look is more desirable.
