Texaco, Digital Equipment, NYNEX, BellSouth and Merck and Company.

Other companies participating in the study were: Chevron, Citicorp, Eastman Kodak, Ford Motor Company, General Electric, General Motors, Mobil Oil, Pacific Telesis, Texaco and 3M.

Six corporations refused to provide information for the report: American International Group, Dow Chemical, E.I. du Pont De Nemours, GTE, IBM and Philip Morris.

Among the study's other findings:

Giving to programs for African Americans made up 37 percent of the total grants studied; programs for Hispanics made up 12 percent; and giving to multiracial

There was no apparent relationship between a corporation's publication of affirmative action or non-discrimination policies and the total amount of funding awarded to racial and ethnic populations.
