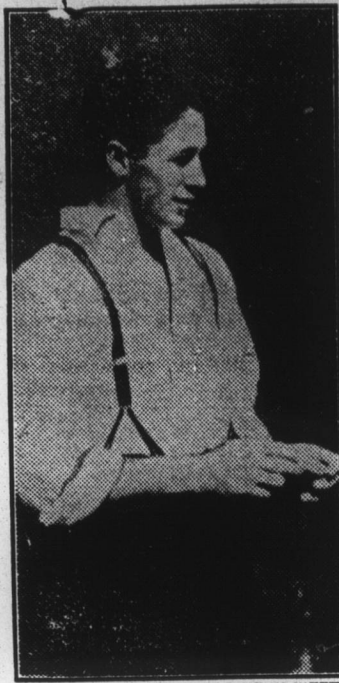


**HEAVY SENTENCE FOR GIRL**

Wise, Va. — At the end of her second trial for the murder of her father, Trigg Maxwell, 22-year-old Edith Maxwell was sentenced to 20 years for second degree murder. This is only five years less than her first sentence, and she is free under bail pending an appeal. She is accused of beating her 52-year-old parent with the heel of a slipper when he objected to her staying out after midnight.

**MRS. SIMPSON NOT TO SEE EDWARD FOR SOME MONTHS**

**Expects to Spend a Quiet, Family Christmas, With No Special Events Being Planned.**

**DECLINES TO DISCUSS MARRIAGE WITH EDWARD**

Cannes, France, Dec. 21 — Mrs. Wallis Simpson plans to wait several months before she sees the Duke of Windsor again, her host at the villa Lou Viei, Herman L. Rogers, told International News Service today.

He said: "There is no possibility at all of Mrs. Simpson seeing the Duke of Windsor before spring. We are going to pass a quiet, family Christmas, with nothing special planned."

**Plans Indefinite**  
Indicating Mrs. Simpson has no definite plans, which are understood to be subordinated to Edward's decisions. Rogers denied Mrs. Simpson has any idea of buying or renting a house on the Riviera at present. He added:

"There is no possibility of her having anything in view at the moment. She will remain here for several months."

Rogers said Mrs. Simpson spends most of her time at the villa writing letters, reading and taking occasional afternoon drives.

**Chats With Reporters**  
Earlier, marking the first and only time since the abdication of former King Edward that Mrs. Simpson has consented to see correspondents, she received me and two other American newspaper men in the garden of the Rogers' villa, and for the first time in her life she talked freely to reporters. She chatted informally for more than a half an hour, but refused to give permission to her visitors to quote her.

Dressed simply but elegantly in a trim sky blue skirt and smartly cut plaid jacket, she appeared at ease despite a slight nervousness.

**Discusses Riviera**  
We had hardly been introduced when Mrs. Simpson suddenly turned and walked farther back into the garden under the shade of a large olive tree. A photographer had suddenly appeared at the driveway and was being rushed out by a detective.

But with a good-natured smile lighting her face, Mrs. Simpson bantered with us about all the places in which she had been reported during the past few days and discussed the Riviera's beauty spots.

**GERMANY RATIONS FATS**

Berlin, Germany — Flaring red posters flashed the news all over the Reich that citizens must register on the official customers' list of their food store or go without butter, margarine and lard this winter. Only 80 per cent of the usual seasonal supply of fats was available.

Mrs. T. L. Renfro of Green Mountain, Yancey County, makes five trips a day to a spring located 100 yards from the house. She figures that the gravity water system now being installed will save her 207.4 miles of travel a year.

Though the acre yield of peanuts

in Martin County was lighter than usual this year, the quality was good and prices were fair.

R. C. Hunter of East Laporte, Jackson County, harvested 1800 pounds of seed from 3 1/2 acres of Korean lespezea.

Arrested for breaking a window, Anson County turkey growers sold 8,000 pounds of the holiday birds to a large meat company for \$1872.84, the price being lower than was expected by the growers.

New York City — On the back of every steamship ticket are hundreds of words in fine print resigned to protect the steamship line against certain liabilities. When George B. Moran sued the Swedish-American Line for \$25,000 for a fall in a bath tub on the S. S. Kungsholm, the Line pointed to the protective clause. In deciding for the passenger, the United States Court of Appeals held that he had no knowledge of any time limitation and therefore could not be held by the contract.

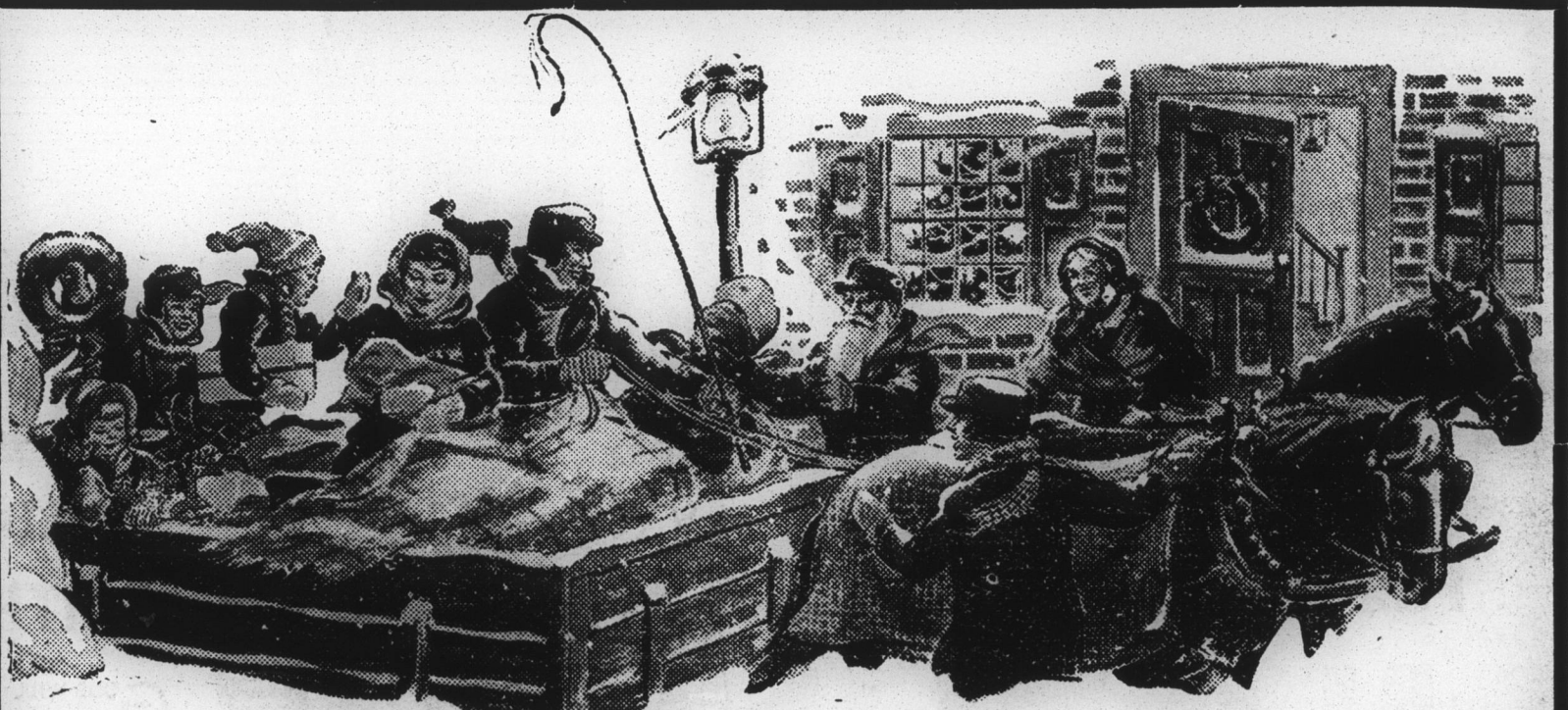
