No one knows now whether Person County will remain in the dry column or will move into the wet column. As things now stand, Person County has voted dry. The majority was 22 votes and the "wets" do not believe that this majority is enough for the "drys" to stand upon until the votes are recounted.

The term wet is being used to apply to those who are in favor of control stores and the term dry applies to those who are against the stores.

A recount has been demanded and this demand will be granted by the board of elections. Whether the result will remain the same will be determined at this recount.

There seems to be more interest in the result of the election now than there was in the election. Many people who had said little about it before the 29th. are now saying plenty.

We have an idea that this election is not over, but whether the "drys" will be on top when everything is over or not cannot be accurately predicted.

Saturday, July 3rd., has been designated as Safety Parade Day and Trade With Safety Day in Roxboro. Captain Jim Lynch and his Magic Safety car will be in Roxboro and a safety demonstration will be given. There will also be a big safety parade and the merchants of Roxboro will have hundreds of bargains for the large crowd of shoppers who are expected here.

Safety Parade Day has been a big occasion in many cities in the United States. Thousands of people have gathered to see the parade and now Roxboro has thrown out the extra added attraction of a big bargain day.

The Chamber of Commerce is behind the movement and many merchants are lending their cooperation one hundred per cent.

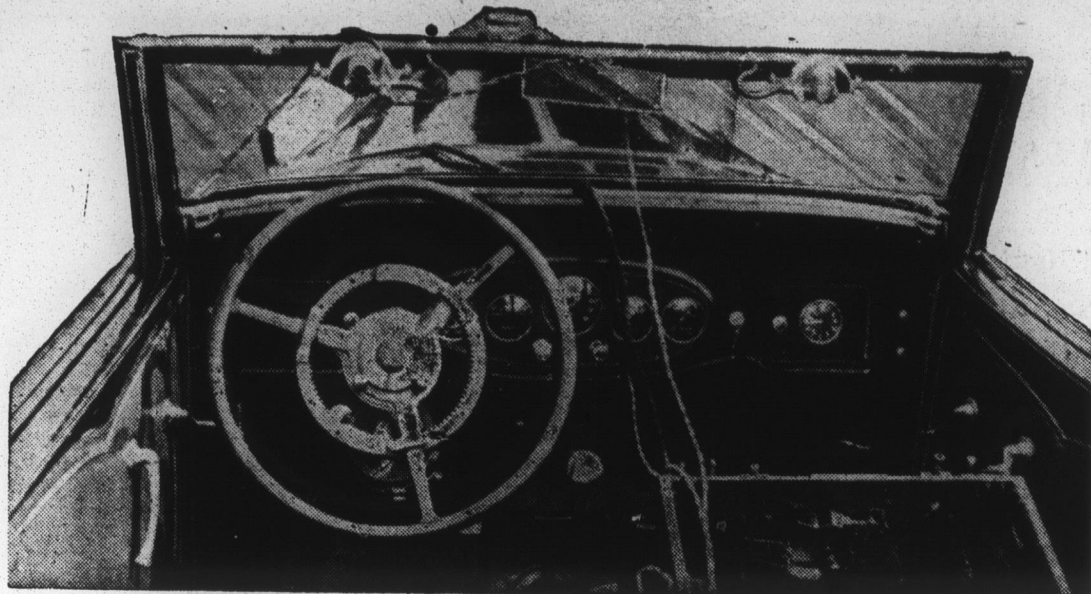
The people of this territory are invited to come to Roxboro Saturday and see the parade and visit the stores. You are in for a real treat in many ways.

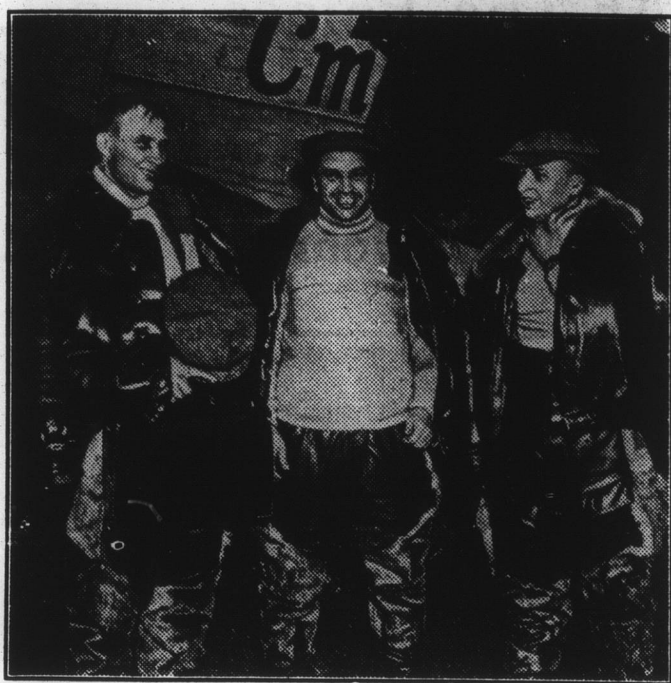

Dogs that were pets are dead - But - a child might have picked up the food that the poison was on and children might be dead today as a result.

This is the second time that this has happened in Roxboro in the last six months. It's a very dangerous happening and it's up to the police force of this city to start to work. If any person put out as much poison as was evidently put out there must be some evidence left behind and that evidence should be sifted down.

Hail, the farmer's fear at this time of the year visited Person County Wednesday. It was one of the hardest hail storms for this season that is remembered. Some places were hard hit and as usual the storm cut a path across one section of the county. It is too late to re-plant and farmers who were hit can only look at the damage, unless they had insurance.

Dr. Albert Allen

Dr. Albert Allen is expected in Roxboro today to take over the duties of Dr. S. V. Lewis of this city, who has been the assistant director of the Person - Orange health district for the past fifteen months and also has been in charge of the Person County office. He is being transferred to Plymouth, N. C. to take over a health district in that section of the state composed of Hyde, Washington, and Tyrrell Counties. This is a promotion for Dr. Lewis and he and Mrs. Lewis will probably leave for Plymouth about July 15.

Dr. Allen is from Jackson, N. C. where he has been in charge of the public health work in Northampton County. He finished the public health course at the University of North Carolina and has been connected with the state board of health since that time.
