## Hints To HOMEMAKERS

A little dry mustard or salt rubbed on the hands and then rinsed off will remove onion odors.

To remove onion or fish odors from pans in which those and odoriferous foods have been cooked, wash the pans in hot soapy water to which one or two tablespoons of vinegar have been added.


